

## 203 Dundee Avenue – Contributing



**ARC 02-35** – exterior modifications including a two and one-half (2 ½) story addition

At this location is an 1894 house that has recently become a bed and breakfast, the Barrington House. This asymmetrical Folk house has a cut stone foundation, a hipped roof of sawn cedar shingles with copper ridge runners, two interior central brick flues and an exterior of brick veneer. The main (W) façade has a projecting hipped roof porch with replacement Tuscan columns. The main entrance is an original four-light and three-paneled wood door with an original three-light transom and one-light and one-panel sidelights. At the rear is a hipped roof addition with a cut stone foundation and brick veneer siding. The windows throughout are one-over-one wood sash with wood surrounds and stone sills and lintels.
