

207- 209 Dundee Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, side-gabled Queen Anne-influenced duplex built ca. 1894. The house has a continuous stone foundation, a roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of brick veneer. On the main (W) façade are similar, single-story, shed roof porches with replacement square wood posts and railings and wood floors. A two-story projecting gable bay on the west facade divides the two units. Windows are one-over-one double hung wood sash with simple wood surrounds. In the gable fields are louvered vents and weatherboard siding. On the south façade is a secondary entrance with a concealed door and on the rear façade is a large, original wing with an exterior of aluminum siding, a poured concrete foundation and arched basement windows with single-light awning windows.
