

308 Dundee Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1915. The house, formerly a wing of the Hough Street School (as was 316 Dundee Avenue), has a continuous poured concrete foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior end chimney covered in vinyl and an exterior of vinyl siding. The full-width porch was enclosed and a second story added with a hipped roof ca. 1945 with a triple set of one-over-one double hung metal window on the first floor and two, paired sets of one-over-one double hung metal sash windows on the second story. Vinyl siding was added later. The main entrance has a ca. 2000, six-panel metal door with an inset wood panel transom and single-light and single wood panel sidelights. Above the entrance is a canvas awning and leading up the doorway is a spindled wood railing and stone walkway. Windows are one-over-one double hung wood sash with flanking vinyl shutters. A projecting hipped roof bay on the south façade has no windows only vinyl siding. Also on the south façade are two octagonal vinyl windows, one on the first floor and one on the second floor. Above a triple set of windows on the main façade is a dentiled and bracketed wood lintel.

To the northwest of the dwelling is a ca. 1960, two-bay garage with an exterior of vinyl siding, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows and two, metal overhead track doors.
