

212 E. Hillside Avenue – Contributing



This is a two-story, frame, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1880. The house has a gable roof of asphalt shingles, brick and concrete infill foundation, an interior brick chimney that appear to be rebuilt and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (S) façade is a partial width, hipped roof porch with chamfered wood posts on square wood piers. The posts have milled wood decorative brackets. The main entrance has a ca. 1990, glass and wood door with a simple wood cornice surround and exterior wood screen door. Windows are original, two-over-two and four-over-four double hung wood sash with simple wood cornice surrounds. On the rear façade is a gable roof wing. On the west façade of the rear addition is a shed roof bay window and a gable roof wall dormer with a sliding track window. On the east façade of this wing is a ca. 1995, frame garage that is attached to the house via a small gable roof hyphen. The hyphen has an entrance on the south façade that matches the main entrance and leads to a small frame landing with a wood railing and posts.
