

316 E. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



Located at 316 East Lincoln Avenue is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare style dwelling built ca. 1902. The dwelling has a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney, a continuous brick foundation and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (S) façade is a one-story, full-width porch enclosed with large, four-light fixed glass and wood window panels and weatherboard siding. The entrance to the porch has a ca. 1980, fanlight glass and wood door. The main entrance to the house from the porch retains its original, single-light glass and wood door. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash. At the roofline of the main façade is a shed roof dormer which has a pair of ca. 1960, two-light sliding track metal windows one of which has an air conditioning unit in the frame. On the west façade is a small, gable roof dormer with a triangular window. On rear façade is a ca. 1980, two-story, frame porch with a two-story wood staircase attached to an original, two-story rear wing.
