

317 E. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



This is a one-and-one-half-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The dwelling has a poured concrete foundation, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior brick chimney and an exterior of aluminum siding. On the main (N) façade is a full-width, hipped roof porch enclosed ca. 1960 with five-light, jalousie metal windows, weatherboard siding and an aluminum and glass storm door. Windows are original two-over-two horizontal and four-over-four double hung wood sash. Within the enclosed porch on the main façade is an original, single-light fixed picture window flanked by two-over-two double hung wood sash windows and an original six-light and wood panel door with a wood surround leading into the dwelling from the porch. On the west façade is an added shed roof aluminum carport supported by wrought iron posts. On the rear façade is a ca. 1960, hipped roof wing.

Off the rear of the dwelling, down a slight slope and beneath a large weeping willow tree is a ca. 1904, two-bay, frame garage with an exterior of weatherboard and aluminum siding, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, a concrete block foundation and two, ca. 1930, vertical metal panel overhead track doors. **Contributing**
