

106 E. Russell Street – Contributing



Located at 106 E. Russell Street is a two-story gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1915. The dwelling has a continuous poured concrete foundation, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of aluminum siding and an interior central concrete-covered chimney. On the main (E) façade is a partial-width, hipped roof porch supported by ca. 1965, wrought iron posts and railings on a poured concrete floor with a ramp extending out to the rear of the dwelling. The main entrance has an original single-light and wood panel door with an aluminum and glass storm door. Windows are original one-over-one double hung wood sash with flanking louvered wood shutters on the south façade. Also on the south façade is a large single-light fixed picture window with a single-light transom. On the rear façade is an original, single-story, gable roof wing with an exterior of aluminum siding.

Off the northeast corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1970, single-bay, frame garage with an exterior of aluminum siding, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, a hollow core wood door and an metal panel overhead track door with four, sunburst patterns panels at the top. **Noncontributing**
