

109 Harrison Street – Contributing



Located at 109 N. Harrison Street is a two-story, frame, rectangular American Foursquare dwelling built ca. 1910. The house has a continuous stucco foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick flue and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (W) façade is a hipped roof, full-width porch enclosed ca. 1980 with vinyl siding, wood stairs, a concrete block foundation and wrought iron handrails. The main entrance is a ca. 1990, single-light and two-panel metal door with single-light glass and wood sidelights. On the north facade is a secondary entrance with a recessed, ca. 1990, nine-light and two-panel metal door. Windows throughout the dwelling are ca. 1985, one-over-one double hung vinyl sash. At the roofline on the south façade is a hipped roof dormer with four-light fixed wood windows and on the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with a replaced hexagonal-shaped, single-light fixed window. Also on the south façade are fifteen-light French doors.



Off the northeast corner of the dwelling is a single-bay garage with front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard siding, and an original, two-light and horizontal panel metal overhead track door. **Contributing**
