

131 Harrison Street - Contributing



Located at 131 N. Harrison Street is a two-story, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1915. The house has a continuous concrete block foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior end brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) façade is a central entry porch with a Mansard roof supported by Tuscan columns, a wood baluster railing and a wood floor on brick piers. The main entrance retains its original, six-panel wood door with an aluminum storm door and original, eight-light glass and wood panel sidelights. The upper façade has a central entry with an original, fifteen-light glass and wood door with a nine-light glass and wood exterior door and an aluminum and glass storm door. On the main façade are original picture windows on either side of the entry with an eight-over-one double hung wood sash window flanked by six-over-one double hung wood sash windows. At the roofline on the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with a triple set of four-light fixed windows and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the south façade is an original gable roof lateral wing with a hipped roof wall dormer with a pair of eight-over-one double hung wood sash window with wood surrounds. The south façade has two entries, one with a ca. 1980, six-panel metal door and one with an original, single-light glass and wood panel door with an aluminum storm door. In the gable fields are fixed louvered vents.



The right (north) side of the "ell" is actually a different address: 231 Applebee. This separate north entry has a gable roof entry porch supported by square wood columns, a wood baluster railing and a wood floor. The entrance retains its original, six-panel wood door with a wood cornice surround.

Behind and to the left of the structure is an original, single-bay garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, a six-wood panel pedestrian door, hinged double wood doors, exposed roof rafters and original, six-light fixed wood windows with wood surrounds.
