

303 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, frame, front gable Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The dwelling has a brick foundation, a front gable roof of wood shingles and two interior brick flues. On the main (W) façade is a ca. 1900, shed roof entry porch with an original wood floor, large milled columns on square wood piers and an original eight-light and one-wood panel door with a storm door. Windows are six-over-six double hung wood sash with wood surrounds and ca. 1910, wood shutters. On the north façade is a ca. 1900, hipped roof entry porch with milled columns on square wood piers, a hipped roof, an original wood floor and lattice over the wood pier foundation. On the S façade is an exterior end brick flue and a hipped roof bay window with elongated dentils and brackets. The bay window has original two-over-two wood windows with wood surrounds and a brick base. On the rear façade is an original wing with four-over-four and one-over-one double hung wood sash windows. On the rear façade of the original wing is a wood-shingled shed roof porch enclosed for use as a mudroom with a wood shingle shed roof, an original, single-light fixed windows and a six-light and two-panel wood door.



To the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1903, frame, two-bay garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard and two, original, fifteen-wood panel overhead track garage doors. **Contributing**
