

410 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



ARC 01-25 – one-story rear addition

ARC 06-13 – the addition of two box bay windows, two double-hung windows, the removal of three existing double-hung windows and the replacement of a wooden door



At this location is a two-story, frame, cross gable plan dwelling with Queen Anne detailing built ca. 1880. The house has a gable roof asphalt shingles, a central interior brick chimney, a brick foundation and an exterior of weatherboard siding. In the northwest corner is a small, hipped roof porch enclosed ca. 1925 with three-over-one vertical-light wood sash windows, weatherboard siding and contains the main entrance ca. 1980, six-wood panel door. On the east and south elevations are slightly projecting bays with decorative pilastered wood frame surrounding a paired set of narrow one-over-one double hung wood sash windows

above which is a multi-colored shingle pent roof with diamond wood panels, a sawtooth motif and small brackets. In the gable fields is decorative vergeboard. Other windows in the dwelling are paired, one-over-one double hung wood sash with wood cornice surrounds. On the south façade is a ca. 1930, hipped roof, one-story addition with a single-light fixed window possibly used for a bathroom. On the rear façade is a wood deck with square wood baluster railings.

Adjacent to the dwelling is a ca. 1970, frame, single-bay garage with an exterior of aluminum siding, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles and a metal panel overhead track door. In the gable field is a single-light fixed window. **Noncontributing**
