

411 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



Located at 411 S. Grove Avenue is a two-story, frame, double front gable Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The dwelling has a continuous stone foundation covered with concrete, an exterior of weatherboard siding and a double front gable roof of asphalt shingles with gable returns. On the main (W) façade is ca. 1930, hipped roof entry bay with a double arched light and two wood panel door with a flanking three-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash window. Windows are three-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash with wood cornice surrounds. On the main façade is a projecting bay with wood shingled pent roof, a paired set of three-over-one double hung wood sash windows, pilasters, a dentilled cornice beneath which is an inset wood panel and supported by heavy wood brackets. In the gable fields on the main façade are a three-light fixed attic window with a wood cornice surround and a louvered apex vent. On the north façade is an original, single-story wing.



Off the southeast corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1985, two-bay, frame garage with an exterior of weatherboard siding, a front gable roof with gable returns, a hinged vertical wood panel upper façade door and two, sixteen-wood panel overhead track doors. **Noncontributing**
