

## 416 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, brick veneer, side-gabled Tudor Revival style dwelling constructed ca. 1927. The dwelling has an exterior of brick veneer, a central interior brick chimney and a clipped gable tile roof of terra cotta tiles. The main (E) elevation has an arched recessed entrance with a keystone and brick voussoirs (wedge-shaped pieces) and a full-width, stone, concrete and brick patio. The main entrance door has a segmental arched and vertical board door. The windows are twelve-light casement windows and two-light fixed windows with single-light transoms. All windows have brick lintels and

brick sills. On the south façade is a projecting hipped roof bay with a terra cotta tile roof, a brick veneer exterior and a set of paired windows. On the north façade is side entry with a shed roof canopy supported by wood brackets. On the rear façade is a ca. 1950, sun porch addition with an exterior of brick veneer and window panels.

Attached to the house on its northwest corner via the sun porch is an original, one- and one-half story, single-bay garage with an exterior of brick veneer, a clipped gable roof of terra cotta tiles, an original single-light and two-vertical wood panel pedestrian door, a four-light and twelve-wood panel overhead track door with a wood cornice lintel. In the gable field on the east façade is a paired set of nine-light fixed windows with wood surrounds. **Contributing**
