

## 506 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



### ARC 01-19 – addition and remodel

At this location is a two-story, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1900. The dwelling has a stone foundation, a hip and gable roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of weatherboard siding. The main (E) and south facades have a wraparound porch with Tuscan wood columns, square wood baluster railings, wood floors and stone piers. The main entrance retains its original, single-light



glass and wood door and a single-light fixed window flanking the door both with wood cornice surrounds. On the rear façade is an original two-story wing with a secondary entrance on the north façade. The north entry has a single-light and three-panel wood door above which is a hipped roof canopy supported by single "S" design wood bracket supports. Above this entrance is a shed roof wall dormer with paired, two-light fixed windows. There are matching gable roof dormers on the north and south facades with paired one-over-one double hung wood sash windows and weatherboard siding. On the west façade is a large hipped roof addition with weatherboard siding over an open-air carport.

Located to the rear of the dwelling is an original, single-bay, frame garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an overhead track metal panel door. **Contributing**
