

513 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



Located at 513 S. Grove Avenue is a two-story asymmetrical Queen Anne style dwelling constructed ca. 1905. The house has a stone foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, a central interior brick chimney and a newly constructed exterior wall brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) and north elevations is a ca. 1930, hipped roof wraparound porch with a square wood railing and Tuscan wood columns with Ionic capitals resting on wood panel piers. The main entrance retains its original glass and wood door with a rectangular transom. Adjacent to the entry is a paired set of single-light fixed windows. On the main and north facades are large, two-story bay window each with a pyramidal roof and a large central single-light window with a rectangular transom with flanking single-light one-over-one double hung wood sash window on the first floor and one-over-one double hung wood sash on the second floor. Other windows in the dwelling are one-over-one double hung wood sash and single-light fixed designs. Windows have wood cornice surrounds with corner blocks. On the main and north facades are small, gable roof dormers each with a one one-over-one double hung wood ash attic window.

Associated with the house is a ca. 1960, frame, single-bay, one- and one-half story garage with a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard siding, an interior brick flue, a metal panel overhead track door and a one-over-one double hung vinyl sash window in the gable field.
