

517 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-and a half story cross-gabled Queen Anne influenced Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The house has a central hipped asphalt shingle roof with projecting gable bays, a rebuilt interior brick chimney, a stone foundation and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) and N elevations is a wraparound porch built ca. 1980 with milled posts and railing. The main entrance has a multi-light glass and wood door with a multi-light transom. On the main façade, the projecting gable bay has chamfered corners on the first story with one-over-one sash at the corners. Between them is a large sixteen-light glass and wood window with a multi-light transom. The second story has two one-over-one windows connected by a single wood cornice and a rectangular multi-light diamond light window. In the gable field is a square multi-diamond light window. Other windows are one-over-one wood sash. On the E elevation is a small one-story hipped roof wing that serves as a sun porch with four-over-four wood sash windows. The entrance to this wing has a two-light and four-panel wood door.

To the rear is a two-bay detached garage.
