ARC 13-16 – second story addition, removal of existing enclosed front porch and construction of a new open front porch

At this location is a one-and one-half-story, frame, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1910. The house has a brick foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of asbestos shingles. The main (E) façade has a gable roof canopy supported by large dentil brackets set on a hipped roof porch enclosed ca. 1960 with one-over-one fixed wood windows and weatherboard siding. The main entrance is a ca. 1970, nine-light glass and wood door with flanking one-over-one fixed wood windows. Other windows in the dwelling include one-over-one double hung wood sash and two-over-two double hung metal sash, all with flanking wood plank and diamond detail shutters and wood cornice surrounds. In the gable fields are louvered apex attic vents.

Off the southwest corner of the dwelling is an attached single-bay, frame garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of vertical board siding and an original metal panel overhead track door.
