

536 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



ARC 06-01 – addition of two dormers, one on the south roof, one on the north roof

At this location is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare dwelling built ca. 1910. The house has a stone veneer continuous foundation, an exterior of vinyl siding, an interior brick chimney and a hipped roof of asphalt shingles. The main (E) façade the original full-width porch was replaced ca. 1980 with a gable roof entry porch with fluted Tuscan columns, vinyl scaling in the gable field and a single-light glass and wood door with an aluminum and glass storm door. Windows are one-over-one double hung vinyl sash with vinyl surrounds. At the roofline on the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with a triple set of fixed single-light vinyl windows. On the south façade is a ca. 1980, two-story bay window with three, one-over-one vinyl windows on each floor separated by vinyl scaling and supported by heavy modillion brackets. On the rear façade is a ca. 1985, hipped roof addition with a large brick chimney.

Attached to the south façade of the rear addition is a ca. 1985, single-bay, frame garage with an exterior of vinyl siding, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and a thirty-two-metal panel overhead track door.
