

615 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



Located at 615 S. Grove Avenue is a two-story, cross gable plan, frame dwelling built in the Italianate style ca. 1880. The house has a cross gable asphalt shingled roof, a brick foundation, a central interior brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the first floor of the main (W) façade is a large, flat roof bay window with four, narrow-width, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows with decorative brackets, modillion blocks and raised rectangular wood panels at the cornice and inset wood panels in the base. The main entrance is on the north elevation of the front gable section of the house and has a ca. 1985, multi-light glass and wood door. The entrance leads from the dwelling to a small, flat roof entry porch with a decorative cornice with brackets and modillion blocks. The porch has a square corner post and simple ca. 1980, wood railing. Windows are original, one-over-one wood sash set in wood frame surrounds with bracketed cornices with modillion blocks. Heavy, paired modillion brackets are at the eaves.



Off the northeast corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1990, frame, single-bay garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of vinyl siding, a metal panel overhead track door. In the gable field is an elliptical window with sunburst sectioning and at the ridge of the roof is a hipped roof cupola with a metal weathervane. **Noncontributing**
