

616 S. Grove Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a two-story rectangular Colonial Revival-influenced dwelling built ca. 1910. The house has a continuous stone foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior end brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (E) façade is a ca. 1970, single-story, gable roof entry porch with an arched valance, Tuscan wood columns, a dentil cornice and engaged fluted square wood columns. The main entrance has ca. 1980, three-light and wood panel door with fluted square wood pilastered surround and pediment. Windows are four-over-four double hung vinyl sash with wood cornice surrounds and flanking shutters. On the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with weatherboard siding and two, original, six-light fixed windows. On the north façade is a façade is a small, hipped roof bay window with three, single-light windows supported by wood brackets. On the rear façade is an enclosed side porch with a poured concrete floor and eight-light casement windows.



Attached at the rear façade of the dwelling is a ca. 1980, single-bay, frame garage with a side gable roof of asphalt shingles, a weatherboard exterior and a ca. 1980, thirty-two metal panel overhead track door. **Noncontributing**
