Located at the corner of South Hough and West Lincoln Avenue is the Salem United Methodist Church which is a two-story, stone veneer, Neogothic church originally built in 1893 and rebuilt in 1951. The building has an exterior of random course stone, a hip and gable roof of asphalt shingles and a concrete foundation. On the main (N) façade which faces Lincoln Avenue is a one-story entry vestibule with an arched entrance containing original double wood doors. Over the doors is an arched, leaded and stained glass transom. Recessed behind the entrance bay is a two-story, rectangular bell tower with arched louvered vents and stone pilasters. The main section of the church on the primary façade has stone and concrete wall buttresses. In the gable field is a quatrefoil attic window. Windows are one-over-one wood sash of diamond light stained glass design on the main façade. Some windows on the east façade are arched.

At the rear is a two-story education wing with added anodized aluminum windows.
