

121 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



This is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare dwelling built ca. 1900. The dwelling has a stone foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (N) façade is a one-story, full-width porch with ca. 1925, square tapered, Doric motif, wood columns and a railing with square wood balusters. The main entrance retains its original, single-light and three wood panel door and single-light glass and wood sidelights. Windows are original one-over-one double hung, rectangular wood sash. On the second story central bay is a diamond light fixed window flanked by large brackets. On the east façade is a two-story polygonal bay with three, one-over-one wood sash windows. At the roofline on the main and west facades are hipped roof dormers with paired diamond light attic windows.



Attached to the dwelling on the west façade is a ca. 1990, hipped roof garage with a nine-light and metal panel pedestrian door and a sixteen-metal panel overhead track door. **Noncontributing**
