

200 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



Located at 200 W. Lincoln Avenue is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1905. The house has a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney, a stucco-covered concrete foundation and exterior of asbestos shingles. On the main (S) façade is a single-story shed roof porch with original Tuscan wood columns and a railing with milled wood balusters. The main entrance retains its original, six-panel wood door. Windows are original, two-over-two rectangular double hung wood sash. On the first floor of the main façade is a large fixed, single-light window with a stained glass transom. In the gable field is a rectangular attic single-light fixed attic window. At the gable eave is a king post and verge board. On the rear façade is an original, single-story, frame wing reconstructed ca.1970.

Located off the northeast corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1930, two-bay, frame garage with an exterior of shiplap siding, a gable roof and original twenty-wood panel overhead track garage doors. **Contributing**
