

217 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



ARC 10-11 - construct small addition to side entry and rear addition to detached garage

Located at 217 W. Lincoln Avenue is a one-and one-half-story, frame, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The house has a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of stucco, a ca. 1940 exterior wall brick chimney and a stucco-covered continuous stone foundation. On the main (N) façade is a ca. 1920, partial-width, shed and hipped roof porch with Tuscan wood columns, wood stairs and a square wood baluster railing. The main entrance has a ca. 1980, glass and wood door. Windows are original, six-over-six double hung wood sash windows with simple wood cornice surrounds. On the south façade is an original, single-story gable roof wing with a ca. 1980 gable roof extension off the west façade with an entrance and an exterior of vinyl siding.

Located off the southwest corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1945, single-bay, frame garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of vinyl siding and an original, twelve-wood panel overhead track garage door. **Noncontributing**
