

223 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



Located at this address is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1880. The house has a stucco-covered brick foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (N) façade is a full-width, shed roof porch with original Tuscan wood columns and a square wood baluster railing resting on a foundation of rock-faced concrete block piers with ca. 1990, milled panels infill. The main entrance has a ca. 1990, glass and wood door. Windows are ca. 1990, one-over-one rectangular double hung vinyl sash. However, the windows flanking the main entrance are original, tow-over-two glass and wood fixed design.

At the rear is an original, one- and one-half-story, frame garage reconstructed ca. 1990 with an exterior of vinyl siding, a side gable roof of asphalt shingles and replacement vertical board hinged double doors. **Noncontributing**
