

235 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



Located at 235 W. Lincoln Avenue is a two-story, brick and stucco rectangular Folk dwelling built ca. 1906. The house has a continuous brick foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and exterior of stucco. On the main (N) façade is an original one-story, hipped roof porch with stucco covered brick piers and which was enclosed ca.1930 for a sunroom with original, four-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash windows. The main entrance has a ca. 1930, six-light glass and wood door and three-light glass and wood panel sidelights. Windows are original, one-over-one rectangular double hung wood sash with original wood surrounds. At the roofline on the main and east façades are gable roof wall dormers with a single-light fixed attic window. Also on the east façade is a two-story, projecting bay with three, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows.

At the rear is a ca. 1970 frame garage. **Noncontributing**
