

## 248 W. Lincoln Avenue – Contributing



**ARC 01-21** – addition to the west side and rear of the existing structure as well as the removal of existing aluminum siding

Located at 248 W. Lincoln Avenue is a one- and- one-half-story side-gabled Craftsman dwelling built ca. 1920. The house has a side gable roof of asphalt shingles, a stucco-covered continuous concrete foundation and exterior of masonite shingle siding. On the main (S) façade is a full-width, shed roof porch with original stucco-covered brick columns and a solid stucco-covered concrete railing. The main entrance retains its original, multi-light glass and wood door. Windows are ca. 1995, one-over-one double hung rectangular wood sash. On the main façade is a large gable roof dormer with paired, one-over-one double hung Craftsman-style windows. At the eaves are knee brace brackets. On the west façade is a one-story gable roof wing with knee brace brackets. A hardiplank shingle exterior has been installed the gable fields.

Located to the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1960 frame garage. **Noncontributing**
