

208 W. Station Street – Noncontributing



This is a one- and one-half story side-gabled Colonial Revival style dwelling built ca. 1940. The house has a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior wall brick chimney, a continuous poured concrete foundation and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (S) façade, the entrance retains its original, six-wood panel door and a broken pediment wood surround with Doric pilasters. Windows are original, rectangular, six-over-six double hung wood sash with wood shutters triangular wood lintels. At the roofline are two gable roof dormers with six-over-six double hung wood sash windows and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the east façade is an original, single-story wing with paired, single-light glass and wood doors. On the west façade is an attached, single-bay garage with a flat roof and an original wood panel overhead track garage door.
