## RESIDENTIAL SEARCH CONSENT

Dear Parent/Property Owner and/or Occupant:

The Barrington Police Department recognizes the growing concern involving underage alcohol and drug abuse in our community. Officers routinely respond to calls involving underage consumption of alcohol, public intoxication, and possession of alcohol or drug violations.

The Illinois Compiled Statutes (235 ILCS 5/6-20) defines the legal drinking age as 21 years of age. Another provision of the Illinois Compiled Statutes (235 ILCS 5/6-16) holds a person responsible for selling, dispensing, or giving away alcohol to any person knowing the person was under the legal drinking age. The same statute holds the person accountable for dispensing or selling the alcohol if the underage person is injured or dies as a result of alcohol consumption. The Village of Barrington Village Code contains similar provisions.

In an effort to protect parents and property owners from unexpected and unwanted violations of alcohol and drug offenses occurring on their property, the Barrington Police Department has developed a consent form allowing officers to search your residence or property, in your absence, in the event of suspicious circumstances which leads an officer to believe either of the aforementioned violations are occurring.

If you sign the Residential Search Consent and Waiver form, you will be waiving your constitutional rights which generally requires police officers to secure a search warrant to protect you against unreasonable searches and/or seizures. However, the Barrington Police Department will not randomly enter your residence unless investigating a call for service. This may involve loud noise/music, a large gathering of juveniles, or illegally parked vehicles. Officers may observe circumstances which appear suspicious considering the absence of adults or parents. Considering these suspicious circumstances, officers will attempt to enter your house to establish the safety and welfare of your children.

The Barrington Police Department will not attempt forcible entry to your house unless an emergency or exigent circumstances exist. Excepting an emergency, a member of the Police Department will only enter your residence if a door or window is found to be unlocked, or a person inside the house unlocks the door for an officer.

The granting of this Consent is not a substitute for adult supervision and control over children as may be necessary or appropriate in a given case, and the Barrington Police Department is not undertaking such responsibility.

Neither the Barrington Police Department, nor the Village of Barrington assumes any responsibility for violations of the law or damage occurring on your property during your absence.

The Residential Search Consent and Waiver must be dated for the time you will be away from your house. A Residential Search Consent and Waiver must be completed for every absence when you desire this added protection.
